TOKYO SUNDAY – 25 JANUARY 2026

On January 25, 2026, the archdioceses in Cologne and Tokyo will celebrate the 72nd annual "Tokyo Sunday". This year, the "prayer and aid community" is standing together at the side of the people in Myanmar.

The two archbishoprics have a special relationship with the local church in Myanmar - one of the poorest countries in the world. The people have been suffering since the military coup four years ago. Many had to leave their homes and have been fleeing the violence ever since. The church in Myanmar has been supporting all Burmese with its mission for years, thereby promoting dialogue beyond religion and ethnicity.

Last year, the two archbishoprics commemorated the displaced people in the South East Asian country and took up a collection for the people suffering from the effects of the civil war. In addition, delegations and the bishops of the three countries visit each other regularly and revitalize the partnership.

At the same time as "Tokyo Sunday" in the Archdiocese of Cologne, "Cologne Sunday" will also be celebrated in Tokyo on January 25. Cardinal Josef Frings from Cologne and his Japanese brother Peter Tatsuo Doi from Tokyo founded "Tokyo Sunday" in 1954 as a "prayer and aid community". Financial support from Cologne for the partner diocese of Tokyo has no longer been necessary since the Japanese economic boom of the 1960s and 70s.

Archdiocese of Tokyo

Christians are a small minority in Japan. Around 19 million people live in the archdiocese of Tokyo, only around 96,000 of whom are Catholic. This corresponds to only around 0.5% of the population. Geographically, the archdiocese today covers the Japanese prefectures of Tokyo and Chiba. The archdiocese of Tokyo was founded in 1891 after Christianity was officially banned in Japan until 1873. Tarcisius Isao Kikuchi has been Archbishop of Tokyo since December 2017. Together with the dioceses of Niigata, Saitama, Sapporo, Sendai and Yokohama, the Archbishopric of Tokyo forms the ecclesiastical province of Tokyo, which extends across eastern Japan.
